

Greg's Great Big Cabled Scarf

Greg hasn't been knitting all that long but he's always wanted to make a long cabled scarf and with a little planning and the help of a cable needle, he came up with this pattern. We think it's really cool when new knitters experiment with yarn and needles and don't let a little thing like cabling intimidate them. You can do it too!

Materials: 1 skein Cascade Magnum (100% pure wool, 113m/100g), 12mm knitting needles, large cable needle

Gauge: 8 sts over 10 cm in stocking stitch on a 12mm needle

Cable 6 forward (C6F): slip next 3 sts onto cable needle and hold at front of work, knit next 3 sts from left-hand needle, then knit sts from cable needle.

Cast on 14 sts, loosely, with 12mm needles.

Row 1: k2, p1, k1, p6, k1, p1, k2

Row 2: k3, p1, k6, p1, k3

Row 3: k2, p1, k1, p6, k1, p1, k2

Row 4: k3, p1, k6, p1, k3

Row 5: k2, p1, k1, p6, k1, p1, k2

Row 6: k3, p1, C6F, p1, k3

Repeat rows 1 – 6 until yarn is almost gone or until you've achieved the length you want, ending with the completion of a row 5.

Cast off and wear!
